His works include 'From Boer War to World War: Tactical Reform of the British Army, 1902-1914' and 'Stemming the Tide: Officers and Leadership in the British Expeditionary Force, 1914'. His most recent work is 'At All Costs: The British Army on the Western Front, 1916'.
