### Fireside Chat with John Bolt

Tonight's Fireside Chat is being presented by John Bolt on the subject of the American Battle Monuments Commission (US version of CWGC). John is originally from Boston, Massachusetts in the USA. He was commissioned as a US Marine Corps Officer and served for 10 years on active duty.

In 2013 John moved to the UK, here John completed graduate studies, both an MA and a PhD in history at the University of Portsmouth. His time at Portsmouth enabled him many unique opportunities and contacts to further his study and research of the Royal Marines and the subject of tonight's talk is based in part on some of his recent PhD thesis.

John Bolt is the Assistant Superintendent of the Normandy American Cemetery in Normandy, France. John helps look after the well-known American cemetery which overlooks the D-Day landing beach of Omaha where over 9,300 soldiers are buried and a further 1,500 with no known grave are commemorated.

If you watched the latest season of the BBC's 'Who Do You Think You Are?', you will briefly caught John as a contributor to the episode with comedian Joe Lycett, who discovered he had a Royal Marine ancestor in the mid-Victorian era.
