FALKLANDS 40 A huge thank you to all those attended and supported the various commemorations throughout the UK. The main thrust for RNA Central Office was the Portsmouth weekend with Beat the Retreat, Civic dinner, AGM, F40 forum, dinner dance and the march which included the presentation of the Freedom of the City of Portsmouth to the Royal Naval Association. More detailed coverage of the F40 events that the RNA were involved in will be included in the circular.

COMMEMORATIVE BENCHES As part of the F40 commemorations, the RNA in tandem with the association of Wrens commissioned to commemorative benches to honour those that remain on patrol in the South Atlantic from HMS Sheffield and HMS Coventry, the two T42 destroyers that were Portsmouth based and lost in the Falklands 40 years ago.
