

TRAFALAGAR DAY - Friday sees the 217th anniversary of the Battle of Trafalgar. Many RNA branches have already held or will be holding dinners and other events to commemorate Nelson and all those that fell with him. Enjoy the event and rejoice that you will not be speaking French! The picture below is an original broadsheet print produced on or shortly after November 7th 1805, the day after Lieutenant John Lapenotière, the Captain of HMS Pickle, arrived in London with the Trafalgar Dispatches. This broadsheet sold for over £10,000 in 2005.
