HMS MONTROSE FOUR YEAR DEPLOYMENT ENDS Around 800 family members and friends – many holding banners (see picture below) – lined the jetty at Devonport Naval Base to welcome home the ship, which hasn't been in the UK since October 2018. Since leaving home, HMS Montrose has spent the bulk of her time deployed in the Gulf region; more than three-and-a-half years conducting patrols to safeguard merchant shipping, tackle criminal and terrorist activity, including arms and drugs smuggling, and working with allies as part of the international security effort.
