FINE DAY FOR A PARADE Despite dire predictions for wet and windy conditions in London, last Sunday turned out to be a fine day for the Naval Associations Biennial Parade in Whitehall, with veterans from a dozen associations joining shipmates from the RNA and colleagues from Belgium and Ireland in a ceremony at the Cenotaph. Also on parade were serving personnel from HMS Collingwood and HMS Sultan and a Royal Marines Band – in all, more than 300 on parade, with hundreds of supporters and bystanders watching from behind security barriers along Whitehall, and an impressive display of more than 40 standards.
